Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009 (Central Act 35 of 2009)—Section 23 (2), 1st Proviso—Obtaining the Teachers Eligibility Test

qualification under the Act is mandatory and the consequence of not obtaining such qualification flowing from the scheme of the Act is that the in-service teachers would cease to have any right to continue in service - Anjuman Ishaat-E-Taleem Trust v. Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009 (Central Act 35 of 2009)—Section 23—Teachers Eligibility Test—Inservice teachers who have not qualified TET and have less than 5 years of service left can continue in service—Inservice teachers recruited prior to enactment of the Act and having more than 5 years to retire on superannuation shall be under an obligation to qualify the Teachers Eligibility Test within 2 years from date in order to continue in service—If they do not acquire the qualification within 2 years, they will be compulsorily retired - Anjuman Ishaat-E-Taleem Trust v. Travancore Christian Succession Act, 1092 (Kerala Act II of 1092 M.E. (1917 A.D.)— Succession Act, 1925 (Central Act of Indian 39 1925) -Applicability-Intestacy opens on the death of the estate holder- Where the intestacy opened in 1940, succession was governed by the Travancore Act, 1092—The Indian Succession Act, 1925 became applicable to Travancore only after the enactment of the Part B States (Laws) Act, 1951 -Part B States (Laws) Act, 1951 (Central Act 3 of 1951) - Susan Thomas @ Sumol and others v.
