Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 (Central Act 26 of 1996)—Sections 11 - If the execution court finds that an arbitral award is unenforceable and invalid for any reason, in order to initiate fresh arbitral proceedings, it is essential to make a fresh request/issue fresh notice to the opposite party to appoint an Arbitrator - Manapuram Asset Finance Ltd. v. Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 (Central Act 2 of 1974)—Section 378(4)—Special leave to appeal against an order of acquittal can be granted only where the petitioner prima facie demonstrates that the judgment suffers from gross miscarriage of justice, patent illegality, or perversity - Purushothaman C. Constitution of India—Article 226—Domicile—Domicile of origin and domicile of choice— Domicile in law relates to the country having a distinctive legal system and not to any particular place within the country —Consequently, where issuance of a Domicile Certificate is sought by an Indian citizen on the basis of residence, such certificate must be granted having regard to permanent residence and intention to reside permanently or indefinitely, and not merely the place of birth - Sohan V.M. v.State of Kerala and others - I.L.R. 2026 Kerala OnLine 50 : [Neutral Citation No.](#)

Constitution of India—Articles 14, 21 and 21A—Right to life under Article 21 of the Constitution includes the right to menstrual health— Inaccessibility of menstrual hygiene management measures strips away the right to participate on equal terms in school—Inaccessibility of menstrual hygiene management measures undermines the dignity of the girl child, as dignity finds expression in conditions that enable individuals to live without humiliation, exclusion, or avoidable suffering—The substantive approach to equality under Article 14 demands that treatment be accorded with due regard to the individual, institutional, systemic and contextual barriers that impede the translation of rights in reality—Court issued directions to States and Union Territories with respect to multiple aspects of ‘menstrual health’—Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009 (Central Act 35 of 2009)— Sections 3, 18, 19 and 25—Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Rules, 2010 (Central)—Rule 16 - Jaya Thakur (Dr.)v.Government of India and others - I.L.R. 2026 Kerala OnLine 51 SC : [Neutral Citation No.2026 INSC 97.](#)

Co-operative Societies Act, 1969 (Kerala Act 21 of 1969)—Sections 2 (j), 32 and 90—An apex society can be considered as ‘financing bank’ when it satisfies the conditions under Section 2(j) –Before passing an order under Section 32(1) of the Act to supersede the Committee, Registrar shall consult the Circle Co-operative Union or the State Co-operative Union, as the case may be,under sub-section (2) irrespective of the fact that the society concerned is affiliated to the Circle Co-operative Union or the State Co-operative Union or not—Co-operative Societies Rules, 1969 (Kerala)—Rule 139 - Sabu K.V. v.
